



A Brief History of the Pigskin Club of Washington, D.C. Inc.

The Pigskin Club was the brainchild of the late Dr. Charles B. Fisher, a former star football player on the Howard University football teams of 1917, 1919, and 1920. Being impressed with the benefits that derive from wholesome athletics and understanding the problems incident to participation in competitive sports, Dr. Fisher conceived the idea assembling men who had received benefits from such activities and forming them into an organization. He discussed these ideas with several friends with like interests and called a meeting for **Tuesday**, **July 25**, **1938**.



In a note announcing a larger meeting, Dr. Fisher wrote:

Dear Friend of Football

On Saturday night, July 30, 1938 at nine o'clock, I am asking those whom I believe are interested in the formation of the Pigskin Club to meet at my home. To become a member requires no fee. The purpose and eligibility are stated on the enclosed card.

May I have the pleasure of seeing you?

July 30, 1938 - 18 notable men met at his house. October 7, 1938 - 51 men became Charter Members during a formal organization of the Pigskin Club at the 12th Street Branch Y.M.C.A

Since the first meeting, in 1938, the Pigskin Club has become one of the leading and influential sports organizations in the Nation. Under the leadership of Charles B. Fisher, the Club became a rallying point for college lettermen, coaches and citizens interested in clean sports and fair play.

At many luncheons and dinner meetings, high school athletes received academic and athletic achievement awards, All-star sports aggregations and coaches have also been honored.

In 2018, The Pigskin Club expanded their awarding ceremonies to a Spring Awards Banquet to recognize and honor those student-athletes and coaches participating in Spring sports.





After winning the starting position halfway through his freshman season, Caleb took the college football world by storm becoming one of the biggest stories of the season.

Caleb delivered what might be the most memorable acceptance speech ever for the winning the Heisman Trophy. Three elements stand out most for me. First, his reference to Gonzaga College High School and living the mantra, #MenForOthers. Second, was the love he showed for his mother and father. Third, was sharing that he had established the Caleb Cares Foundation- https://www.calebwilliams13.com/caleb-cares-foundation/. The entire message really demonstrated a level of humility and recognition of so many people in his life that is the essence of a man for others.

He entered his sophomore year as the starting quarterback for the University of Southern California. Caleb led the Trojans to an 11–3, 8–1 in Pac-12 play to earn a trip to the Pac-12 championship game. USC moved into the AP Top 4 for the first time in 5 years. Caleb and his teammates re-establish USC as a perennial powerhouse.

Michael Locksley is a Washington, D.C. native. He has 30 years of coaching experience and in 2022 he had his 14th season with the Terps over three separate stints at Maryland.

In 2022, Locksley signed a contract extension through the 2026 season. In his fourth season, Locksley started with 3-0 with wins over Buffalo, Charlotte, and SMU. He finished the season going 4-5. Lockley would finish the year with an 8-5 overall record and a 4-5 conference record. He was bowl eligible for a second straight season which Maryland had not achieved since the 2007 and 2008 season. Locksley won the Duke's Mayo Bowl defeating NC State 16-12.

In 2021, the Terps posted their first winning season since 2014 and won their first bowl game since 2010. Maryland's potent offensive attack was on full display during this season, setting numerous school records, including the single-season marks for total yards (5,740) and passing yards (3,960).

Under Locksley's tutelage, quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa has developed into one of the best quarterbacks in the Big Ten. The Locksley and Tagovailoa connection has elevated Maryland's passing game to heights never seen before. Tagovailoa set seven single-season Maryland records in 2021, including program best marks for passing yards (3,860), completions (328), completion percentage (69.2) and passing touchdowns (26 – ties school record).

Locksley's Terps capped off their 2021 season with a 54-10 win over Virginia Tech in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl. Maryland's 54 points in the game marked the most ever for a Terrapin team in a bowl game and it was the most points ever scored by any team in Pinstripe Bowl history.

In August 2020, Locksley announced the formation of the National Coalition of Minority Football Coaches (NCMFC). The NCMFC was formed as a multi-pronged effort to remove roadblocks, increase awareness and spur action toward fair and equitable hiring at all levels of football. The non-profit organization seeks to prepare, promote and produce qualified minority coaches to ascend in the ranks of college and professional football.






