### The Pigskin Club of Washington, Inc. Mistress of Ceremony

Christy Winters-Scott is the lead basketball color analyst for college games for ESPN, FSN, CSN, and the Big Ten Network's women's basketball coverage. She's also a WNBA analyst for the Washington Mystics and a high school basketball coach for her alma mater at South Lakes High School in Reston, Virginia. She is also the host of the NBA's Washington Wizard Pre and Post game shows.

The former University of Maryland college basketball player was a state high school champion as a player at South Lakes in 1986, when she led her team to an undefeated campaign (29-0). During her senior season she led the Seahawks to a 29-0 record and helped them win the 1986 AAA State Title. Winters-Scott was named DC Metro Area's All-Met player of the year by the Washington Post, The Washington Times, and The Fairfax Journal, while averaging 23 points, 14 rebounds, and 6 blocks a game. For her high school career Winters-Scott scored 1,785 points, 1,075 rebounds, and 492 blocks.

Winters Scott earned a full scholarship to play collegiate basketball at the University of Maryland from 1986-1990. While at the University of Maryland, she recorded 1,679 points (second in Maryland history), 723 rebounds (fourth in Maryland history), and played 123 career games (first in school history). She is one of only two players to score more than 700 field goals (703) at Maryland. Winters also ranks in the all-time top 10 at Maryland in games started (4th with 100), blocked shots (5th with 91) and field goal percentage (8th with .537).

After graduating from Maryland, Winters Scott wanted to continue competing, but WNBA wasn't yet in existence, so she headed overseas where she spent a year playing in Pistoia, Italy and another two years in Fribourg, Switzerland. During her final professional season in Switzerland, she averaged 37 points and 12 rebounds per game, and had a career high of 48 points while competing for the Euro Cup.

Currently, Winters Scott lives with her husband, Jerome Scott, and three children Jerome, Brianna, and Jordan in Reston, Virginia. Winters Scott broadcasts 20 to 30 college games a year and all Mystics TV games, Wizards games, AND coaches her alma mater. Winters Scott also holds an impressive resume of awards: ACC 50th Anniversary Team, South Lakes Athletic Hall of Fame, University of Maryland Hall of Fame, ACC Women's Basketball Legend, and Shirley Povich Center for Sports Journalism, Distinguished Terrapin Award, and was most recently recognized by ESSENCE Magazine as one of the top 12 African American female sports reporters in the Country.

- Kristian was also an outstanding student in the classroom, boasting a 4.5 grade point average and earning a place on the "All-State Maryland Academics team" for 3 years.



In addition, he produced over a dozen David E. Talbert theatrical productions, including "He Say, She Say... But What Does God Say? starring Kirk Franklin.

He has accumulated over thirty film credits and his priority remains his commitment to educating students in the DMV and across the globe, by ensuring they are allowed to experience the film industry through shadowing OCTET Productions' department heads in order to garner experience working with different production line items and gaining experience in filmmaking. Chuck has given lectures at colleges and universities and continues to build programs that give others access. OCTET has worked with and kids from The Covenant House, Duke Ellington School of the Arts, Howard University, Prince George's County Community College and has a partnership with Bowie State University's Fine Arts Department.
